

Abouna's Corner

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EPIPHANY

(Christ our Daily Bread of Life)
2 Corinthians 9: 1 - 15 / John 6: 1 - 15

In the Gospel today Jesus' identity is manifested to us through his miracle of the multiplication of the fish and bread. He is the *Heavenly Nurturer* and the *Giver of Life!* Like Moses, who by the power of God, provided for his people sustenance in the desert, now Christ Our Lord, provides sustenance for his followers on their journey to the promised Kingdom.

Saint Paul, in his Epistle, speaks to his contemporary Christians about the "gift of promise" that they already carry with them on their journey. This *Gift* of Christ our Lord, he observes, has already borne fruit in them as they have become sharers in his divine holiness. And just as Jesus would call his apostles "friends" and not "slaves" because of their special relationship to him, so now also, St. Paul calls his fellow Christians: the "saints!"

Now we too, like Mary, carry within us Christ our Sacrament, the gift of God the Holy Trinity, as we have become sharers in his holiness. In meditating on the Eucharist, Saint Ephrem often prays to Jesus with wonder describing the Eucharistic bread and wine as being filled with the power and fire of the Holy Spirit – the Fire of Mercy – not for our judgment, but rather for our nourishment for eternity. By his mercy, Christ has fused his whole self with us for our salvation!

Likewise in our Maronite prayer after communion (Anaphora of St. Sixtus) we hear:

O Christ, the Divine Bread, who desired to be our imperishable food, at your second coming, do not allow us to become the food of the unquenchable fire. We will glorify and thank you, O Christ, now and forever.

In Christ we have gifts within gifts: He is carried by us in our sacraments (*Raze*), and yet dwells within us. With him "the Coal of the Fire of the Holy Spirit" we also carry the Spirit as our light into the world. And with both of them – Christ and the Spirit – we are in turn carried and lifted up to the bosom of the loving Father. For this we give daily thanks to Our Father in Heaven for his wonderful grace:

O Lord,

Our mouths, used to earthly food, give you thanks for your *grace* by which you have enabled us to receive the divine *gift* of the body and blood of your only son.

(Thanksgiving / Anaphora of Sixtus)

Like Mary, how fortunate and blessed are we to become carriers of divinity! What an awesome Gift and responsibility do we have to carry! Thus we proclaim in St. Ephrem's Hymn of Light:

Let us glorify the majesty of the Son and give thanks to the almighty Father, who, in an outpouring of love, sent him to us, to fill us with hope and salvation!
