### **Reflection** TheBirth of John the Baptist Lk 1:57-66

Most High and Incomprehensible God, You established the ages in Your goodness and brought them into being, You made heaven in Your wisdom and adorned it with the stars, and by Your will You caused a fruitless and barren womb to beget the Voice to herald Yourself.

This is the first half of a prayer begins the Maronite celebration of the Birth of John the Baptist. The same God Who has made and gifted all created things to mankind in the beginning has sent His herald, John the Baptist, to herald Him. But what exactly does heralding mean? The task of the herald of a king was to carry the crest of the king's family, and act as a forerunner – go ahead of the king to deliver messages, and make known his coming – both by his words and by the sign of the house crest of the king.

It is appropriate, then, that we say John the Baptist heralds Christ, his Lord and God. As we heard at the Announcement to Zechariah, John's father, God was sending John into the world "to make ready for the Lord a people prepared" (Luke 1:17). John is running ahead of his king, the King of Kings, Jesus Christ, to deliver His message and make way for His coming. Today, we celebrate John's arrival to "go before the Lord to prepare his ways, to give knowledge of salvation to his people" (Luke 1:76b-77).

As mentioned previously in the reflection in the Announcement to Zechariah, John's very existence when he is conceived from a barren womb makes known that God shall come to make even the barren fruitful if they follow Him. But John's entire life becomes devoted to heralding the Lord. The office of the herald exists solely for the service of his lord, and so John made his life in service to his Lord. In preparation for the coming of his King, he made it known the absolute necessity of repenting and obtaining the forgiveness of sins, preparing the People to receive the Lord of All. Another task of a herald was carrying his lord's armor and weapons for battle at times, and John offers us the very weapons and armor of our Lord in baptism. As the Syriac Father Jacob of Sarug says in his homily on Epiphany, the Holy Spirit made the Jordan, where John baptized Christ, a forge for the armor and weapons of the Holy Spirit.

The armament that John prepares the way for is much greater than iron or steel. When we put on the armor of the Spirit, as St. Paul tells us, we put on Jesus Christ Himself (Gal. 3:27) to stand against all evil (Eph. 6:13). And just as armed soldiers do not stand idly thinking their armament is sufficient, to be baptized alone does not suffice. We must use what we have received in baptism to prepare the way – in prayer, in fasting, in almsgiving, and in good deeds to all people. These are the battles of Christ on earth – the serving the Kingdom of God. Though, to earthly eyes, it would seem like John the Baptist failed because he was killed, he heralded the way once again for the true Way, Jesus Christ, Who chose freely to die so as to give life to the world. Perhaps we will suffer what seem loses and defeats on earth, whether the small insults or large persecution, but we must not be deterred from doing the work of the Lord in John's example for the wage for true service to God is eternal life amongst the righteous and just united to Christ, as we know John the Baptist achieved. May his prayers be a rampart to us.
