<u>Abouna's Corner</u> The Genealogy of Jesus Mt 1:1-17

My Dear Brothers and Sisters:

There is great consolation in knowing that we have a God who is intimately involved in his creation, intimately cares what happens to us - a God willing to plunge right into our world. Our God is not a disinterested observer. It's comforting to know that we have a God who, when things go awry, is willing to take matters into his own hands to bring about the effects and changes he so desires. He doesn't leave us to fend for ourselves. All we have to do is want God to help us and he will, right?

Like so many things (especially when it comes to faith), the answer is yes and no.

Yes-God wants nothing more than to fill our lives with all good things.

Yes-God wants to heal our wounds and dry our tears.

Yes-God will pursue us down every path as he strives to bring us back to the fold and embrace us in his love.

Yes—God forgives our sins and gives us chance after chance after chance.

Yes—God wants to heal every broken heart and mend every relationship. Yes, yes, yes. God will always do his part. Of that, we can be absolutely sure. That's just who God is. And nothing we can do (or not do) will ever get God to stop loving us. The truth is, every single one of us is utterly dependent on God for everything.

However, our loving God doesn't seem to want to do it all by himself. That doesn't seem to be his way of doing things. Rather, he wants something from us—from imperfect you and from imperfect me. What does he want? You know the answer. He wants our "yes." And so, as we wait and prepare to experience our Lord and Savior in a new way this Christmas, as we await Jesus coming and doing his part to heal a broken world and heal the brokenness in every human person, we must also pledge to do our part—that is, look for ways to continually say yes to God's invitation, say yes to whatever it is that God is asking of us. In what situations have I been saying "no", when what I really need to do is say "yes"? Maybe I need to refuse to keep hanging on to a particular grudge, and instead say yes to forgiveness and understanding and letting go. Maybe I need to stop avoiding a person I'm not too crazy about, and instead say yes to finding the good in that person. Maybe I need to quit giving only from my excess, and instead say yes to true sacrificial giving—giving that actually costs me something. And maybe I need to say no to always doing what I want to do in life, and instead say yes to sincerely letting God lead my way down whichever path he chooses for me.

My friends, Jesus wants nothing more than to transform the world into the beautiful place his Father created it to be, wants nothing more than to once again break into and infuse every corner of the world with his mercy, compassion, peace, generosity, and love. But because he loves us so much, he chooses not to do it alone. Rather, he wants us to be an integral part of bringing glad tidings to the poor, healing the brokenhearted, and proclaiming liberty to captives. He wants us and invites us to share in that holy work, wants us to love as he loves. Sound impossible? Not when God and each of us work hand in hand. This Christmas, just say yes! Reflect on the great mystery we are about to celebrate. It really is incredible if you think about it. Our loving God chose to visit his people, to become one of us, and to do all he could to heal the wounds we had brought upon ourselves. God loves us so much that he was willing to immerse himself completely in our world and our human condition, in order to make things right ---- in order to infuse every aspect of our existence with his love, his compassion, and his mercy. He didn't come to scold. He didn't come to punish. He simply came to love and to show us how to love. What a God we have!

May you all experience His grace and protection during this season and each day of the coming year.
