Safe Environment Presentation for Children (Grades 1 - 6):

To all St. Sharbel Parents of children (Kindergarten thru high school) participating in the Catechism Programs (Altar Servers, Sacrament Preparation, Angel Scouts, and Crossroads):

The US Bishops' *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* is requiring each Catholic parish to offer personal safety education for the children in all our programs. Our Eparchy requires us to participate and follow the policies that are in place by the Archdiocese of Portland.

To comply, the Archdiocese of Portland has implemented the *Called to Protect* programs for children and young people in all parishes. All minors in Catholic schools and in parish, religious education or youth ministry activities are required to participate in these programs, <u>every school year</u>.

For our children in Sacrament Preparation and in Angel Scouts (grades in 1st thru 6th): On Sunday, September 30 at 9:15 AM, I will be presenting the *Called to Protect* program to our children. I will present the program upstairs in the classroom.

Measure 106

The measure would prohibit public funds from being spent on abortions, except when medically necessary or required by federal law. Under the measure, an abortion would qualify as *medically necessary* if a licensed physician determines that a woman would suffer an injury or death unless an abortion is performed. Under the measure, public funds may be spent on abortions in circumstances of rape or incest or diagnosed ectopic pregnancies. Ectopic pregnancies, also called extrauterine pregnancies, are pregnancies where a fertilized egg becomes implanted outside of the uterus and has no chance of proceeding normally to birth and which could cause fatal bleeding to the mother.

Reflection

Mt: 24:1-14

At the beginning of this new Season of the Holy Cross, the church, reflects through the holy scriptures at how the victory of Christ has given her new life; how this came through

the preaching of the gospel of the good news of salvation of Jesus her Lord, and by the power of the Holy Spirit.

In the gospel of St. Matthew we hear Jesus speaking of the destruction of the temple as the new beginning of his gospel mission of salvation. Likewise, in a parallel way, Saint Paul speaks of Jesus being raised from the death as itself the new gospel of salvation. For us, the church and her children, who are open to these mysteries, the temple destroyed is intended to be the crucified body of Christ; so that the gospel victory of his resurrection may be preached.

In our Syriac tradition we speak of the Cross of Jesus as a bridge that helps us to cross over to the newness of life: the glory of the kingdom. Christ himself is the gate that let's us into our eternal home. The gate is also the saving wood of his cross.

Saint Ephrem writing in the fourth century, speaking of the Cross as the new Tree of Life, mystically describes the branches of the Tree of the Cross as the arms of a mother who picks-up her children to nourish them with the fruits – the sacraments – from the bosom of her branches. Christ himself, through his saving cross has become for us this Tree of Life; the Luminous Sign of our victory over death through the life-giving graces of the Father's nurturing Spirit.

The Victorious Cross, therefore, becomes the sign of all that is good, coming from Christ the Lord: the gospel, the sacraments, new life, his shield of protection, as well as the sign of his final victory.

This is the gospel (good news) of Christ's salvation; let us rejoice, and may his peace be with us!
