Fall Dinner Shift Sign Ups



Reflection

MT 24:45-51

In today's Gospel we encounter a parable which is meant to teach us something, it was a parable Jesus himself used to teach his disciples. While it might be about many things, there is one thing I would invite you to consider this week. We can all identify times in our day when we know that we are with the Lord. We can also identify other times when we slip into a mentality of doing only what we want to do. And it's in these times that Jesus' teaching takes on new meaning.

Christ compels us to pay attention to our daily action so that we might ask in ways that he would act. We each have tasks which come with our station in life. By examining our thoughts and attitudes towards these things we do in life, we can begin to discover how we move from being fully "awake" and in touch with the Lord to a spiritual slumber that dulls our hearts to His presence. It's always good to ask, "What occasions or situations prompt me to listen for the Holy Spirit's voice and follow his leadings?" And it's just as important to ask, "What occasions or situations make me want to live as something less than a beloved disciple of the Living God?"

Perhaps as a way of practicing, we could look today at our relationships with the people around us. How do I treat those closest to me? Do I look out for what's best for my friends and family? Or do I allow seeds of bitterness, injustice, or selfishness to take root and darken these relationships? Do I try to serve them, or am I more concerned with whether they're treating me the way I feel I ought to be treated? And most importantly, do I ask them for forgiveness and freely offer them my pardon?

Our Lord wants to help us become alert and awake at all times. The One Who Died for Our Sins wants to help us identify the things that draw us closer to him as well as the influences that pull us away from him. He knows that the more alert to his presence we are, the more fully we will experience the new life he has given us.
