

Reflection

Healing of the Blind Man

Every time we attend the Divine Liturgy or pray the office we call out three times in the Qadishat, "Holy are You, O God. Holy are You, O Almighty One. Holy are You, O Immortal One. Have mercy on us!" Each time we call to our holy, almighty and immortal Lord and God, Jesus Christ to have mercy upon us. But precisely what does this mercy do?

In today's Gospel we hear that Bartimaeus, a blind man, calls out loudly to the Lord, "Have mercy on me!" Again and again he cried out because he knew the Lord was nearby and only He could heal him. Many nearby told him to be quiet. Perhaps there were those who thought he was crazy, those who thought he was unworthy and those who simply did not want to hear him. But in spite of what others might have thought, Bartimaeus yelled even louder. "Have mercy on me!" While others told him to be silent, the Lord instructed others to call him over. Bartimaeus's faith overcame the demands of his peers. And when Christ asked him what he wanted Him to do, Bartimaeus responded he wanted to see, because he knew the Lord could grant him sight. Christ responds to him, "See! Your faith has given you life!" and the Gospel tells us Bartimaeus immediately saw (Mark 10:52, Pshitto).

Bartimaeus provides us such a great example of faith. In his blindness he could see better than the rest of those around him. For whatever reasons, others tried to discourage him from calling upon the Lord. Yet Bartimaeus knew the Lord invites all to Himself because, in His mercy, He desires cure all. Like the rest of the healings in this Season of Great Lent, each one who calls out to the Divine Physician is healed. Though we are unable to pay, He is happy to heal us – not because we deserve it or can repay Him, but He wishes us to be whole. He gives to each what they need if they ask Him in mercy, "Have mercy on me!"

We may ask why the Lord does not respond to us as we desire, but in the faith of Bartimaeus we believe that the Divine Physician knows what He is doing. He Who made us knows what we need. Just as a physician must sometimes operate and cause some pain for the overall betterment of a patient, so does the Lord sometimes pain us so that we may be bettered overall. A surgery out of context seems like damage – someone cutting into another person, perhaps removing an organ. But stepping back, one can see perhaps the organ is cancerous and the physician is preventing the spread of cancer to other organs, which would kill the whole body. Likewise, when we sincerely call out to the Divine Physician, "Have mercy on me!" He responds as we need, for He knows the souls He created. In His goodness, He removes those things of which He wishes to relieve us and gives us those situations, which He knows is for our betterment.

Let us be mindful of the faith of Bartimaeus every time we cry out, "Have mercy on us!" Just as those who were healed by the Lord had confident faith in that He could heal them, let us call to Him with our petitions in mind. Knowing that the Lord is the Physician without fail, Whom not even death can conquer, let us cry out, "Have mercy on us!" And let us pray:

O Lord, heal our souls and minds, and gather them from being scattered and wandering in evil thoughts. As You healed and cured the paralysis of soul by the work of Your hands may we likewise by the mystical reception of Your holy body and blood be thrice healed in soul, body and mind. We shall offer glory and thanks to You, and to Your Father, and to Your living and Holy Spirit, now and at all times, forever. Amen.


