COVID MASS POLICIES

- You will need to come with a mask. Mask may be removed to receive Communion obviously. We don't have masks to give you so please bring one.
- I cannot give Communion outside of Mass – this means in your cars, on the sidewalk, etc. Communion for the homebound is suppressed also at this time.
- Sit only in spot marked on pews. Remain physically distant as you enter and exit the church through the basement entrance only.
- No lingering after Mass, you will need to leave directly.
- If your name is not of the sign up list the ushers cannot allow you to come in. We will need to be strict about this and apologize in advance for problems that might arise.
- I request you only use the downstairs entrance, below the main stairs, the other doors will be closed, this will help us to be able to clean commonly touched surfaces.
- We will not allow use of missals, or other books in the pews. Do your best with the responses.
- Only people who are members of the parish are eligible at this point to attend our limited Masses. If you have been coming regularly, and are not registered elsewhere but have not registered with us, now is the time to do this. Archbishop has asked that we keep people going to the parishes they are registered as a way to respect fair and equitable access to all.

Reflection

It is often heard “Why must I go to church if I can pray by myself at home?” In the Syriac tradition, we begin every Church year with the Feast of the Consecration of the Church. This feast celebrates God's plan to make holy and bring all creation close to Him through the Church since Adam and Eve. God created all in His image out of His love, and He wills that all should have eternal life with Him. That eternal life with Him would be accessible, He established the Church as a way of keeping His Mysteries (known as sacraments in the West). These Mysteries are transmitted by His ordained priests. The Mysteries use common things, like water in baptism, combined with the holy rituals of the Church as a means of dispensing His mercy and grace to grant us eternal life and the forgiveness of sins. For this reason, we celebrate the Consecration of the Church because in God's love, He has established for us a treasury of His mercy that we can regularly access through the priests, who have been entrusted the keys.

If one reads the Church Fathers, especially the Syriac Fathers, there is a common marriage image between the Church and Jesus as bride and groom. O You Rich Man Who came down to the feast of earthly men, awake my harp that I sing Your praise. At the banquet of the Church You wed her by baptism's waters and made her Your adorned bride. (From Vespers for the Consecration of the Church)

God, Who is all-powerful and does not become any greater, is depicted as a rich man. In love alone, He has come down from heaven and wed His Church that He created for no reason other than wishing to raise us up out of our lowliness to Him. Where do the Syriac Fathers say the marriage of Christ and the Church took place? At His baptism in the Jordan River (Matt. 3:13-17). Though Jesus was not in need of baptism because He is without sin, He was baptized to show us that, just as creation began with water (Gen. 1:2) so does the new life He offers us in baptism. By Christ's baptism, He wed the Church because it is by baptism that we enter the Church and become part of the Body of Christ (cf. Gal. 3:27). The world began in water, Jesus' ministry began in the waters of baptism, as did the Church, and our life in the Jesus begins by the same waters of baptism.

The Church of Christ, which was wed to Him by His baptism, now continues to baptize. Those who are baptized are washed of their sins and join her in purity in devotion to Christ, the heavenly Groom. Can we pray apart from the Church? No, because Jesus has established the power of the Church and we join both the Church and His Body by baptism. When we pray, we pray as part of the Body of Christ, the Church. Of course, God hears us even if we are not physically at church, but it is when we are united with other members of the Church that we fulfill Christ's saying, “Where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them” (Matt. 18:20). The greatest gathering is the Holy Offering (otherwise called Divine Liturgy or Mass) for Blessed is Christ Who wed you, O Church... and placed in you the holy altar for sins' pardon. He broke, mixed and placed His body and blood before you for you to eat, drink, delight and glorify Him. (From Vespers of the Consecration of the Church)

At the Holy Offering, the priests, whom Christ has ordained to distribute His Mysteries, access the holy altar He has granted the Church. Upon the altar they offer bread and wine which become His Body and Blood, the Medicine of Life given for eternal life and the forgiveness of our sins. This is why we celebrate God's establishment of the Church every year, and why we pray in community rather than only by ourselves.

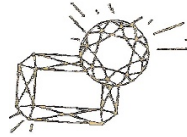

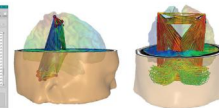
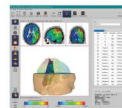
