



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

To paraphrase Dr. Alice von Hildebrand, Catholic philosopher and theologian from her article "Spiritual Motherhood Every Woman's Calling" while I never had the incredible privilege of having children of wown, for goodness sake that doesn't mean I must give up motherhood. 

COVID MASS POLICIES

- You will need to come with a mask. Mask may be removed to receive Communion obviously. We don't have masks to give you so please bring one.
- I cannot give Communion outside of Mass this means in your cars, on the sidewalk, etc. Communion for the homebound is suppressed also at this time.
- Sit only in spot marked on pews. Remain physically distant as you enter and exit the church through the basement entrance only.
- No lingering after Mass, you will need to leave directly.
- If your name is not of the sign up list the ushers cannot allow you to come in. We will need to be strict about this and apologize in advance for problems that might arise.
- I request you only use the downstairs entrance, below the main stairs, the other doors will be closed, this will help us to be able to clean commonly touched surfaces.
- We will not allow use of missals, or other books in the pews. Do your best with the responses.
- Only people who are members of the parish are eligible at this point to attend our limited Masses. If you have been coming regularly, and are not registered elsewhere but have not registered with us, now is the time to do this. Archbishop has asked that we keep people going to the parishes they are registered as a way to respect fair and equitable access to all.

Reflection

Praying for the dead is an important part of Christianity, but particularly emphasized in the Syriac tradition. In fact, traditionally, every last verse of a hymn was always for the repose and forgiveness of the dead. Physical death is an inevitability, but we pray for those who have passed away from this world so that they do not suffer eternal, spiritual death but have eternal life in the Kingdom of God. For this reason, the Syriac calendar has three weeks of commemorations for the dead before Lent begins – the first recalls and prays for the priests who have served the Church.

As God spoke through Ezekiel the Prophet, "I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from their ways and live" (Ez. 33:11). It was through sin – the sin of Adam – that death entered the world (Rom. 5:12). But our Lord Jesus Christ came to return us sinners back to our inheritance of life. As He spoke through Ezekiel, He does not wish that we should die – even when wicked – but that we should repent and have life! This is why God became man Himself to give us every means of salvation and the forgiveness of sin, which He perfected by His own life, death and resurrection. He entrusted the Holy Mysteries to the priests to be performed and distributed, each sacrament like a treasury of mercy. God lowers Himself that He may be made present to us, just as one of the hymns for this Sunday beautifully describes the priests raising the body and blood of Christ our God over the altar:

Great wonder and awe seized the heavenly assemblies when they saw earthly priests raise over the altar the One by Whom heaven is filled and upon Whom they cannot look, but to Whom they cry out in fear and trembling, "Holy, holy!"

God, Whom all the prophets and kings of the Old Testament and millennia past desired to see, is made present to us on the altar. The angels cannot look upon Him, yet He has entrusted the priests to feed us His flesh and blood, the Eucharist, for "the Good One has given His body and His blood so that by them our debts could be forgiven." Even more than the great Mystery of the Eucharist, priests also clothe us in Christ in baptism and forgive us by

His authority by absolution. They teach us the life- giving words of the Gospel of our Lord, instruct us in the way of the saints and give us words of consolation in times of despair that, as the flock of God, we may turn from sin and embrace eternal life. Without the priests, to whom Christ entrusted His Mysteries, we would not have access to the sacraments He prepared for forgiveness and life.

As King David teaches us in the Psalms when praying before God, "No one living is righteous before You" (Ps. 143:2) – including the priests who have been entrusted with His Mysteries, which give us the forgiveness of sin and life! This is why we must pray for the priests, who in this life provided us with means of the forgiveness of sin and the path to eternal life. Now we can assist them by praying that God have mercy upon them and forgive them of all their offenses before Him. The priests who serve the Church, distributing the Mysteries of our Lord, holding the very flesh and blood of God in their hands and calling down the Holy Spirit, are honored with this magnificent duty and great responsibility. As our Lord tells us in the Gospel, "From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded" (Luke 12:48) and that is indeed much. Therefore, we must be particularly diligent in our prayers for the departed priests because much will be demanded of them in their judgment before the Lord. Let us pray to God on behalf of the departed priests with the words given to us in the hymns for this Sunday:

May the feet that tread through the sanctuary tread through the gates of Paradise, and may the ears that have heard Your words never hear sounds of sufferings. May the mouths that sang praise to You not cry from fire's heat, my Lord. Place the priests who nobly served You and diligently shepherded Your people in the Jerusalem above, and may they offer thanks and praise with the angels of heaven to Your Divinity.


