### **COVID MASS POLICIES**

- You will need to come with a mask. Mask may be removed to receive Communion obviously. We don't have masks to give you so please bring one.
- I cannot give Communion outside of Mass this means in your cars, on the sidewalk, etc. Communion for the homebound is suppressed also at this time.
- Sit only in spot marked on pews. Remain physically distant as you enter and exit the church through the basement entrance only.
- No lingering after Mass, you will need to leave directly.
- If your name is not of the sign up list the ushers cannot allow you to come in. We will need to be strict about this and apologize in advance for problems that might arise.
- I request you only use the downstairs entrance, below the main stairs, the other doors will be closed, this will help us to be able to clean commonly touched surfaces.
- We will not allow use of missals, or other books in the pews. Do your best with the responses.
- Only people who are members of the parish are eligible at this point to attend our limited Masses. If you have been coming regularly, and are not registered elsewhere but have not registered with us, now is the time to do this. Archbishop has asked that we keep people going to the parishes they are registered as a way to respect fair and equitable access to all.

### **Reflection**

In the Season of the Resurrection, we celebrate Christ's life-giving Resurrection from the dead, which destroyed death and the slavery of sin. It is curious, then, to look at the prayers for the morning of Great Saturday, the day before Easter Sunday, and see a beautiful hymn about the Eucharist. As beautiful as it is, one may ask what connection the Eucharist has with the Resurrection, which the hymn answers in itself:

#### New life is found by whomever has eaten from Your Table

The Eucharist is truly the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, the same body and blood that worked miracles, suffered, died on the cross and rose for our salvation. Just as Christ's body brought mankind life and healing before His Ascension, which we will celebrate later this month, so too does it even now. The table referred to in the verse is the Table (or Feast) of Life — the holy altar, upon which is placed His body and blood.

#### Your blood which was poured forth on Golgotha killed death and destroyed Sheol.

Just as said above, the same body and blood that saved us is given to us in the Eucharist. The blood which was poured out from Christ on Golgotha, where He was crucified, destroyed death and the place where the dead were relegated before the Resurrection, which is Sheol. This pure blood that wiped away the transgression of Adam, which he committed in the Garden of Eden, and destroyed death is now given to us in communion. Each time we go to communion we receive the death-destroying blood of Christ.

#### Bread and wine, body and blood" any one who approaches shall live by them.

The body and blood of Christ that we receive in the Eucharist, however, is not dead. Christ rose from the dead and lives eternally; likewise His body and blood are living. This living flesh and blood of the living God are given to us that we may eat of the divine life and live. But the divine life is not simply a longer version of human life, but a life free of death and sin, joyfully united to the incomprehensible Holy Trinity in love.

#### May Your body, O Son of God, be the medicine which heals our wounds.

But until we arrive at the eternal life of heaven, we are still ailed by the sicknesses and weaknesses of this world, both in body and spirit. The body and blood of Christ, which we receive, has the capacity to heal us from both. God has given us His body because He loves us and wishes us to have present access to the salvation He wrought for us two thousand years ago. When we consume His flesh and blood, we receive the fullness of life and healing He wishes to impart — whether that is physical or spiritual.

The Eucharist is the Bread of Life — let us approach it in faith and eagerness!
