

COVID MASS POLICIES

- You will need to come with a mask. Mask may be removed to receive Communion obviously. We don't have masks to give you so please bring one.
- I cannot give Communion outside of Mass this means in your cars, on the sidewalk, etc. Communion for the homebound is suppressed also at this time.
- Sit only in spot marked on pews. Remain physically distant as you enter and exit the church through the basement entrance only.
- No lingering after Mass, you will need to leave directly.
- If your name is not of the sign up list the ushers cannot allow you to come in. We will need to be strict about this and apologize in advance for problems that might arise.
- I request you only use the downstairs entrance, below the main stairs, the other doors will be closed, this will help us to be able to clean commonly touched surfaces.
- We will not allow use of missals, or other books in the pews. Do your best with the responses.
- Only people who are members of the parish are eligible at this point to attend our limited Masses. If you have been coming regularly, and are not registered elsewhere but have not registered with us, now is the time to do this. Archbishop has asked that we keep people going to the parishes they are registered as a way to respect fair and equitable access to all.

Reflection

This week we will celebrate the Feast of the Ascension on the 40th day of Easter. It is an important commemoration, as it marks the day when Christ ascended to heaven after His Resurrection. But it is curious to ask why and how we celebrate Jesus' leaving when He promised "I am with you every day until the end of the world. Amen" (Matt. 28:20).

Until this point in the Church year we celebrated Christ's Incarnation, God becoming man, because by Him becoming man He joined His divinity to our humanity. From celebrating His annunciation and birth in December until last month when we celebrated His resurrection from the dead, each event recounts how Christ had no need to be humbled yet He did so to save us from death and sin. It would seem, then, His leaving should be a sad event. But He has joined Himself to humanity, and by Baptism we clothed ourselves in Him (Gal. 3:27).

Though Christ ascends to heaven on the Feast of the Ascension, He does not leave us just as He did not leave His heavenly Father when He became man because He unchangingly remained God, united to His Father. Christ's promise is true when He promised that He would remain with us forever, which is why even on the Feast of His Ascension in Evening Prayer, we sing:

Glory be to Him Who came down. Glory be to Him Who ascended. Glory be to Him Who brought us up with Him to heaven.

We give thanks to God for, though He did not need, He became man to unite His immortal and sinless self to our weak human nature. After He taught us on Earth of His Father and Spirit, He suffered, died and rose to destroy death and sin. He did all of this in His love for mankind. But He ascended to heaven that He could bring us up with Him. The image often given of Christ the Good Shepherd is a shepherd carrying a lamb on His shoulders. The lamb is Adam, who strayed from God's instruction, but He nonetheless went after the lamb to find him. Upon finding Adam, who represents all of humanity, He saved him from death and brought him back to heaven. What is beautiful about the Ascension is that Christ ascended in the flesh – bringing our human nature to heaven, where His divine nature was already forever.

Christ united divinity to our humanity, and by so allowed us, humanity, to participate in divinity – it is a mystery we call theosis. Just as Christ loved us and did all things for us in His mercy, coming down to be near us, so too do we live to be close to Him, Whom we love. On this day we do not celebrate His departure for He never left from amongst us. On His Ascension, He carried our human nature to the Father, that we may aspire to be like Him as He became like us. We thank Him for the greatness of His love and implore His goodness:

In Your love of mankind, O Lord, You emptied Yourself and became man for our sake. You ascended in the flesh to heaven and You amazed the hosts of heaven by Your Ascension near them. Now show us, O Lord, the glory of Your Lordship and make us gods just as You became like us in all things apart from sin. Make us worthy that we may purely and holily glorify You all the days of our lives, and Your Father, and Your living and Holy Spirit, now and at all times, forever. Amen. (Trans. from the Syriac Maronite Evening Prayer for Ascension)
