

# Reflection

"Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" (Luke 2:49)

A common image for Christmas, whether in our minds, on a card, or in the form of statues, is a crèche (otherwise known as a nativity set). We might picture Baby Jesus lies in the food trough of animals, surrounded by Mary, Joseph, a cow, a donkey, and maybe a few other animals, but diligently hide the Three Wise Men before they arrive. This is how we imagine Christ on Christmas, and rightfully so since we are celebrating His coming down from heaven and becoming man. But Christ neither began at His birth nor was He only human. Today's feast of the Finding in the Temple reminds us of Christ's ever-present divinity, in perfect harmony with His having become fully human.

In today's reading from the Gospel, Jesus is found in the Temple teaching the Teachers of the Law, surprising them with His great knowledge of the Law – and He had great knowledge for a reason, since He wrote the Law. This paradox perfectly expresses the paradox of the Incarnation – the Ancient of Days has truly become a child without abandoning His divinity. But the Teachers of the Law, as they will be when they later question Jesus as an adult trying to find reasons to have Him arrested, because they seek to put prove themselves more clever than Christ, our God. Christ will later chastise them as an adult, saying, "You have let go of the commands of God and are holding on to human traditions" (Mark 7:8). They are surprised that a child is so wise, wiser than old men who have studied the Law all their lives, but Christ does this to show that "The wisdom of this world is foolishness in God's sight" (1 Cor. 3:19). They have the answer is front of them in the Law they studied so thoroughly, and yet they cannot see that Christ is God. They search for Him, but they do not find Him because they wish to find Him as they please. Mary and Joseph, pure of heart and sincere, search for Christ and eventually find, though confused with the answer.

We know and profess every Sunday that God is the "Giver of Life" – in fact, we say that Christ *is* life (John 14:6) because He is the eternal God. How often, though, do we turn to human and temporary things to find fulfillment and fall short of finding it? It is very easy to set many items before us as gods like the Teachers of the Law who proposed their own answers, only to lose sight of where God is. Let us continue to strive to search for Christ where He has told us He would be – in His Body, the host, when we receive it (Luke 22:19), when we assemble together for prayer (Matt. 18:20), and in our service to those in need (Matt. 25:40). Though it might sound simplistic, we can truly find happiness if we stop and ask ourselves before doing something, "Will this bring me closer to God?" – otherwise we shall hear "Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be here?"
